THE EDAM NEWSLETTER



The EDucation Against Marginalisation (EDAM) project is a Grundtvig Multilateral project.

The perspective of the project is to enhance AE (Adult Education) by improving its effectiveness in the sense of improving the quality of life of the participants in AE.

The EDAM project runs from October 2009 till October 2011. The project is coordinated by Prof. dr. M. Segers, Maastricht University School of Business and Economics. Eight partners contribute to the project: The Netherlands (co-ordinator), Romania, Italy, Austria, Germany, Denmark, Greece and Belgium. Switzerland has joined the project as a silent partner.

A report on the current situation of adult education in the partner countries is published on the website.

In addition, the international survey is available on the website. The survey measures participants' perception of their growth in social inclusion as well as of how they have experienced the educational program and how they perceive their life circumstances. The survey is based on a former research on the effectiveness of training programs and on social inclusion of vulnerable adults. It was piloted in the Netherlands. With this survey, we aim to better understand in the various partner countries under which conditions adult education programs enhance the increase of social inclusion of the participants.
